### **SECOND INJURY FUND SURCHARGE – STATISTICAL CODE**

Indiana now has available for use the Statistical Code 0935 – Second Injury Fund Surcharge as a method for tracking this assessment. It was approved by the Indiana Department of Insurance on September 21, 2001.

Pursuant to House Enrolled Act 2085, this surcharge is not premium; however, each insurance company must show the assessment on the policy as “a surcharge based on the employer’s premium”. The code is available for use for policies effective back to July 1, 1999, when the law changed, if needed.

For carriers that have experienced rejected policies or USP reports, this code offers a solution to pass the NCCI data edits. For carriers that have not experienced any reporting problems, no change is necessary.

Please note that it is not our intent to require carriers to go back and resubmit policy and USP reports that have already been and are being accepted by the NCCI databases. We are merely introducing a code that members can begin using immediately (or once they add the code to their systems) to ease reporting.

NCCI will issue updated pages in the *Basic Manual* and *URE Workers Compensation Statistical Plan* to reflect that code 0935 is available for use in Indiana.
